LRHS DE Process (SCF)

- Student/parent review SCF eligibility requirements and determine eligibility.
- Student completes the <u>SCF online application</u> and follows all subsequent steps as outlined in the <u>SCF checklist</u>.
- Student and parent review and sign the <u>LRHS DE Enrollment Agreement</u>.
- Student completes the <u>LRHS DE Course Approval Form</u>, indicates courses they plan to take and submits the form to their counselor.
- BOTH of these forms must be submitted to counselor (and approved) by no later than May 1 in order for the counselor to clear the student for SCF registration.
- Counselor will ensure that planned coursework meets any outstanding graduation requirements.

LRHS DE Process (USF)

- **Student**/parent review USF eligibility requirements.
- Student completes the online application for the chosen institution and follows all subsequent steps as outlined in the <u>USF DE student checklist</u>.
- Student and parent review and sign the <u>LRHS DE Enrollment Agreement</u>.
- Student completes <u>USF Course Planning Form 2</u> and submits the form to their counselor along with completed LRHS DE Enrollment Agreement form.
- BOTH forms (LRHS DE Enrollment Agreement and USF Course Planning Form 2) must be submitted to counselor (and approved) by no later than May 1 for the counselor to complete Dual Enrollment Approval (Counselor) Form 2.
- Counselor will ensure that planned coursework meets any outstanding graduation requirements.
- If students are taking USF courses on the LRHS campus, they do NOT have to self-register. Your counselor will register for you.
- If students are taking USF courses on another campus, they will be responsible for registering themselves.

PERT Testing Information

- The PERT Test will be offered on the LRHS campus on Tuesday, March 11 at 7:30 a.m. in the LRHS media center.
- Registration will open on Thursday, February 13 and will close on Thursday, February 27.
- There are only 200 spots available, and registration is on a first-come, first-served basis.
- The cost of registration is \$10 and can be paid on the <u>LRHS website</u> (RevTrak). No refunds will be issued.
- To register:
 - 1. Click on "RevTrak pay LRHS Fines and Fees" (under "Parents & Students" tab).
 - **2.** Click on "Testing".
 - 3. Click on "DE-PERT Registration".
 - 4. Fill out required information and submit payment.

Benefits of Career Dual Enrollment

- All programs provide job-ready training. Most programs take approximately one year to complete and offer the opportunity for licensure or certification.
- Some programs and industry certifications allow the student to earn articulated college credit at State College of Florida (SCF) and other colleges. For more information see an MTC Counselor.
- Schooling is covered for Manatee County students who are part of the district. Student's tuition, lab fees, and some additional expenses are covered. Students however are responsible for some pre- admission costs and uniforms.

Early College Programs

- **Dual Enrollment (up to 11 credit hours)** allows for qualified students to enroll in approved college course-work that will satisfy both high school and college requirements. *Students may qualify as early as 6th grade. Most students begin dual enrollment in the junior year of high school.*
- Early Admissions (12-15 credit hours) allows qualified Seniors to enroll in approved college coursework full time during semester 1 and semester 2 in high school. <u>Students must register for and maintain a minimum of 12 credit hours.</u>
- Accelerated Dual Enrollment (12-15 credit hours) (Public School Students Only) allows qualified rising grade 11 students the ability to potentially earn the AA degree (For Manatee & Sarasota county public school students and Lemon Bay High School & Charlotte Virtual in Charlotte County). <u>Students must register for and maintain a</u> <u>minimum of 12 credit hours.</u>

- Students may register for <u>any part of term</u> during Fall, Spring, or Summer. <u>Full term courses are recommended in Fall and Spring</u>
- Strong students may consider Summer A, Summer B, or Summer C classes
- Students are **required** to follow the SCF academic calendar



Eligibility Requirements

Dual Enrollment (DE) & Early Admission (EA)

- Student must meet with high school counselor to establish eligibility
- Student must hold an unweighted 3.0 GPA
- Student must have <u>qualifying</u> test scores in Reading and Writing and/or Math to be placed into college level courses

Deadlines:

May 15th for Summer/Fall December 1st for Spring



Eligibility Requirements

Accelerated Dual Enrollment (ADE)

(For Manatee & Sarasota county public school students and Lemon Bay High School & Charlotte Virtual in Charlotte County)

- Student must meet with high school counselor to establish eligibility.
- Student must hold a 3.3 unweighted high school GPA.
- Student must have <u>qualifying</u> test scores in Reading and Writing and Math to be placed into college level courses.
- Academically ready for 11th grade. This includes English I & II, Algebra I & Geometry EOC passed & ELA 10th grade state assessment.

Deadlines:

May 15th for Summer/Fall December 1st for Spring

Enrollment Process

- Step 1-Early College Application
 - EC application available at <u>www.scf.edu/apply</u>



- Upon initial review, SCF will send a Welcome Email with student credentials.
- If the student is continuing dual enrollment courses, a new application is not required. (A new application is required to return to the Early College programs after participating in college enrichment/non-degree program)
- Step 2- Official Test Scores <u>must</u> be sent to the Office of the Registrar (<u>registrar@scf.edu</u>) directly by College Board, ACT, or Cambridge. PERT scores may be sent to SCF by the high school counselor. Super scoring is available. SCF students may take the PERT for free with SCF. PERT is by appointment only. <u>Students may test once per semester and no more than</u> <u>twice per calendar year.</u>



Enrollment Process

- Step 3-Early College Contract is submitted as part of the admission process. This digital contract includes the type of enrollment, area of interest (pathway), and a focus option (optional). <u>This form requires</u> <u>student, parent, and counselor approval</u>
- Step 4-Online Orientation is required prior to SCF registration for new students to SCF. Link to complete orientation is included in the Welcome Email.
- Step 5-SCF Registration must be secured <u>prior to</u> the DE deadline. Students should connect with their Success Coach for assistance with registration. Students must submit a detailed schedule to their high school counselor after completing registration.

Dual Enrollment vs Early Admission

Dual Enrollment

- ▶ 9th 12th grade
- ► 3-6 credits first semester
- Takes Up to 11 credits after 6-credits with C or better are completed
- Qualifying testing options ie.)
 Accuplacer (CPT), PERT, SAT, ACT
- ▶ 3.5 + GPA
- Maintains 2.0 GPA in college courses
- Part-time <u>Non-Degree seeking</u> <u>applicant</u> (Non-Degree Application)

Early Admissions

- Senior in High School only (applies while a Junior in High School by March 1st of their Junior year)
- Takes 12 to 15 credits
- **SAT/ACT** qualifying testing only
- 3.8 + GPA
- Maintains 2.0 GPA in college courses
- Full time USF <u>Degree seeking</u> <u>applicant</u> (Degree-seeking application)
- Student would not need to reapply to USF after High School graduation





Dual Enrollment

High School GPA 3.5 weighted and one of these test scores or combination of scores



SAT: 560 Critical Reading / 530 Math



ACT: 21 Reading / 21 Mathematics



PERT: 114 Math / 106 Reading / 103 Writing Offered at State Colleges / Oublic High Schools



CPT (Accuplacer): 256 Reading / 253 Writing / 250 AAF (algebraic functions) Testing Center at USF must bring Photo ID & U#

Step by Step Guide for Dual Enrollment

Step 1

<u>Student Applies to USF as a Non-Degree</u> seeking student from the Dual Enrollment Web Link

Step 2: Student Sets up <u>NET ID & USF</u> email

Step 3:

Student Completes <u>Immunization</u> Documentation *on HS or USF campus

Step 4:

Student Fills out Dual Enrollment Form <u>1</u> (that's your info.)

Step 5:

Student works with counselor to select Courses (this info goes on Form 2) Step 6

Counselor submits Dual Enrollment FORM 2

Step 7: <u>Student Self-Registers</u> for Online or On USF Campus courses

Step 8:

Students get <u>courtesy registered</u> for <u>on-</u> <u>High School USF Dual Enrollment Courses</u>

Step 9

Student must <u>attend first day of class</u> to avoid **DROP.** Log onto online course or attend USF campus





USF Dual Enrollment

TIPS:

- Meet requirements for GPA, Testing Scores
- Apply through dual enrollment website & use the <u>Non-Degree Seeking</u> <u>Application</u>
- Set up your USF NET ID which includes your USF email:@usf.edu
- Complete Student Health Service Medical History Forms to avoid registration holds
- Once you get your U number (U#) Fill out new student FORM 1 (requires U# & NET ID)

TIPS, continued:



- Your Counselor will fill out course selections and submit course approval FORM 2 based on student planning sheets, so communicate with your counselor about your courses.
- Check your MY USF Student Portal for holds and alerts
- Get ready to Self-Register for on-USF campus or online USF courses (you will get emails on how to register) High School Campus courses are courtesy registered.
- Check USF emails regularly, especially before registration as instructions and links are sent to you regularly.
- Drop any classes during drop/add week to avoid a W (late withdrawal)

- Must be a Senior in High School (apply in junior year of high school)
- GPA 3.8 +



SAT: 1300, 580 Critical Reading



ACT: 29, 29 English



CLT: 38 Verbal Reasoning (V+W) 16 Quantitative Reasoning (Q-math)



Step by Step Guide for Early Admission

Step 1:

Student Applies to USF as Degree Seeking Student from Early Admission Web Link while in Grade 11 by March 1st

Step 2: Student Sets up <u>NET ID & USF email</u>

Step 3: Student Completes <u>Immunization</u> Documentation

Step 4: Student Fills out Early Admission Form 1

Step 5:

Student works with <u>School Counselor and USF</u> academic advisor to select courses.

High School Counselor submits Early Admission FORM 2

Step 7:

A) Student must sign up for <u>ORIENTATION</u> so they can register and attend.
B) Student <u>Self-Registers for Online or On USF</u>

USF Early Admissions



TIPS:

- <u>Early Admissions is not Early Decision</u> for Freshman where seniors are applying.
- <u>Early Admissions is for Juniors only</u> and they apply in their Junior Year to attend as a USF Freshman in their Senior Year of high school
- Only <u>Books and Tuition</u> are covered under the Dual Enrollment Scholarship, but students will take a <u>full load of 12-15 credits</u>.
- <u>USF Orientation</u> must be completed before registration is allowed. Sign up for Orientation once you are admitted.
- Work with your <u>assigned USF advisor</u> once you are admitted. Check emails.
- Parking passes, IDs, Dorm-Housing, textbooks that are not required (including lab coats, goggles etc.) are not covered.
- <u>Check USF emails regularly</u>, especially before registration as instructions and links are sent to you regularly.

EARLY ADMISSION 🖕

Early Admission is a form of dual enrollment whereby eligible high school students are admitted to USF as fulltime students for fall and spring semesters of their high school senior year.

During the early admission year, students take 12-15 credits each semester. The courses they take earn credit toward both a baccalaureate degree and completion of the high school diploma.

Early admission is open to students from any high school setting: public school districts, charter schools, private schools, or homeschools. Schools, School Districts, Homeschooled students interested in making early admissions can request an Early Admission Articulation Agreement with USF by submitting an **electronic request.** Use the hyperlink to submit a request.

Students must start the Early Admission Process as early as the summer before or the beggining of their Junior Year of High School.
