## WHY DO WE NEED TO UPDATE RESIDENTIAL ATTENDANCE ZONES?



Enrollment in district-operated schools continues to climb, even with increasing school choice options.



School choice options are insufficient to remedy capacity concerns due to traffic congestion and transportation limits.




There are too many district-operated schools classified as overcapacity, near capacity, or nearing capacity—and these schools are spread throughout the school district.




Future residential housing growth will further constrain capacity in at least two of our four school service areas.




Newly constructed facilities and schools necessitates creation of new—and the adjustment of current—residential attendance zones.
