



2021-2022 Positive Intervention Education (PIE) Program Parent/Guardian General Information

The Positive Intervention Education (PIE) program is designed as an alternative for middle and high school students who have been suspended out of school as a consequence for certain violations of the district Code of Student Conduct. The program provides supervision in a structured environment, along with behavioral and academic assistance for a period of one to ten days. During this intervention program, students will have the opportunity to complete regularly assigned schoolwork, receive academic assistance from a certified teacher, and complete behavioral reflection activities designed to assist students with problem behaviors that may have resulted in their Out of School Suspension. Students are primarily responsible for obtaining all academic assignments from their teachers and submitting them upon return to their zoned school. This program available on a first come-first serve basis with a daily program capacity of 25 students. Students who attend will be counted in full attendance at their zoned school for each successful day completed.

Program Requirements and Information

1. The Intervention Program **cannot accommodate**:
 - a) Students who are ill
 - b) Students who require distribution of medication by a nurse (limited clinic services are available)
 - c) Students with extremely violent offenses or those who present a concern for safety.
2. Students must bring the official Assignment Notification received from the school, in order to be admitted to the program. **Parents, please ensure your child has a signed copy of this letter in their possession** when dropped off or before traveling to the Intervention center.
3. (PIE) begins operation promptly at **07:30 am** each day school is in session throughout Manatee County. Student's **must** be on time. Dismissal from the (PIE) program is at **2:25 pm** for all students. Supervision will be available 15 minutes before and after the normal operating hours. Students who ride the bus (**Bayshore High school only**), arrive on campus prior to the beginning of Staff supervision should go directly to the designated PIE area and wait for staff.
4. Any requests, assistance, or concerns must be addressed with the PIE teachers, who may be contacted at: **751-7003 *2154 Staff: Mrs. Donelson and Mr. Bennett.**
5. Transportation to and from the (PIE) program is the **responsibility of the parent or guardian**. Students who drive may transport themselves and park their vehicles in a designated area (see attached map).
6. Students must bring paper, pencil, and needed school supplies to complete their work.
7. The SDMC dress code (other than uniform requirements) and all rules under the Code of Student Conduct are applicable will be enforced. Student ID's **must** be worn at all times.
8. A school breakfast and lunch will be provided for students. Students are permitted to bring their own bagged lunch. However, please be advised our facility is not equipped to heat or warm food, nor place food in cold storage. A sealed bottle of water is recommended to bring each day.
9. Students must follow all classroom procedures and abide by the SDMC Code of Student Conduct. Any disruptive, disrespectful, or defiant behavior could result in removal of the student from the program or denial of the opportunity to use the Intervention Education Classroom for any future Out of School Suspensions. Students removed from the program will have to be **immediately** picked up by the parent or guardian or given permission to leave on their own.

Dear Parent/ Guardian,

We regret to inform you that your student has committed an offense that warrants an out-of-school suspension. Although your child could be suspended out-of-school, they are eligible for the opportunity to attend the Positive Intervention Education program for the same period of time. This is a VOLUNTARY program which, upon successful completion allows the student to make up missed work they are able to obtain, with no penalty enforced. Please note, upon offering the (PIE) program to a student, the sending school must contact the parent/ guardian to verify that their child will be in attendance. If the student fails to appear (after the parent has indicated the intent to attend), he/she will be marked as an unexcused absence. However, if the parent informs the school that they decline PIE Classroom services (upon offering the PIE program to the parent/ guardian) their child will be marked as an Out of School Suspension. SDMC policy requires that all assigned work be submitted upon return to school. Positive Intervention Education (PIE) Program offers an opportunity to have new assignments communicated to students and for your child to complete their work in a supervised setting while receiving assistance from a certified teacher.

Please also be advised that your child is not to be on any school campus during the school day (other than the appropriate PIE center). Eligibility to participate in extracurricular activities will be determined by the administration of your child's zoned school.

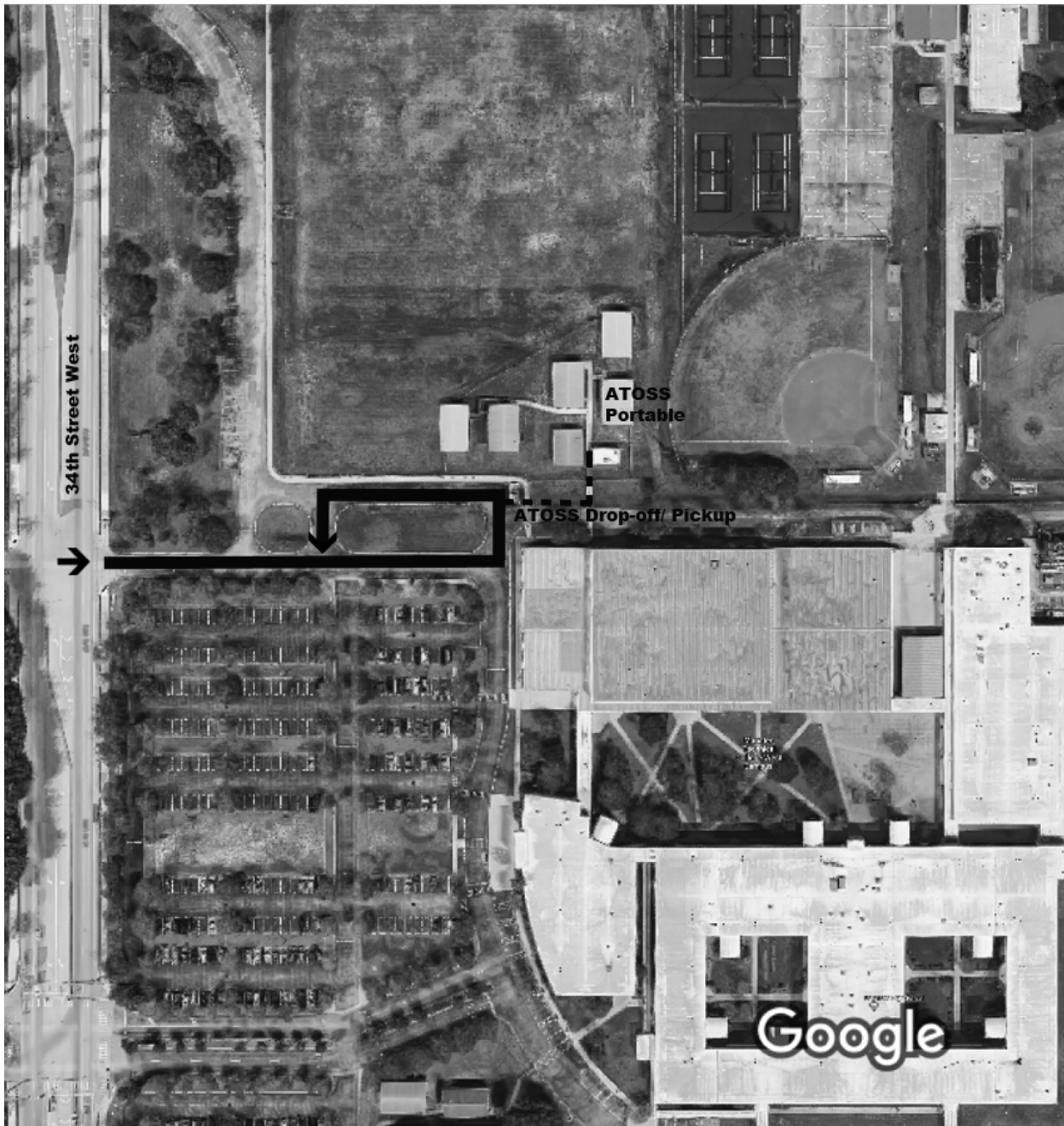
