

SAC Meeting – Manatee High School

September 9, 2024

Members Present: Fleming, Brigg, Norris, Armer, Colonnescio, Gerber, and student representatives: Addison Neary and Abby Clark

Denise Brigg welcomed everyone. Meeting started at 6:02 pm.

16 people present (3 students).

Principal Fleming welcomed all the guests, returning members and new faces in the room. Invited those who may be interested in participating as members of SAC.

1. Mike Barber presented on 2024 Renewal Referendum.
 - Important millage referendum coming up
 - Tuesday November 5th – same date as presidential election
 - Presentation is just meant as informational, not to influence anyone
 - State of Florida allows school boards to ask for the millage.
 - Approx. 56,000 students
 - One of 100 largest school districts in the nation
 - Not a new tax (2018) – passed by 51%
 - 30 minutes extra instruction
 - More competitive pay for teachers and staff working directly with students
 - STEM program expansion
 - Additional support to charter schools (public schools but privately owned)
 - Receive funds in proportion to the number of students they have
 - All the money that comes from the additional mil stays in Manatee County
 - Continuation of the previous tax
 - 2021 – Arts focus
 - Passed by 69%
 - Why?
 - All counties in the surrounding area have the additional mil
 - We are in competition with the counties
 - National teacher shortage
 - 4,000 – 5,000 teacher vacancies in the state (reported in June 2024)
 - Sustainment of the current success and impact
 - Impact
 - Increased 34% in state academic rating
 - Average of 4% increase in each category per grade (reading, math, writing)
 - 24 schools with A rating
 - 3 Title 1 schools with A or B
 - Abel
 - Tilman
 - Ballard (B)
 - Parrish HS earns 1st A

- Pay increase for teachers
 - >\$8000 supplement
 - Approx. \$57,000 annual salary
 - Agreements with SCF, New College, and USF for new teachers from the teacher education programs
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- Outcomes:
 - Cambridge District of the Year
 - TSA State and National winners/leaders
 - Students performing in Carnegie Hall
 - STEM classroom in every elementary school
- Priorities for 2024-2025
 - Increasing security for students and schools
 - Recruiting and retaining teachers and staff
 - Boosting success with more instructional time
 - Increase of 30 minutes each day = 18 days of annual additional instruction
 - Offering real-world workforce education
 - Expanding early literacy programs
 - All students reading on grade level by k3rd grade
 - Adding options for STEM
 - Enhancing arts and athletics
 - Supporting charter schools
- Mil = \$1 per every \$1,000

 - 1. Evolve system has been smooth
 - 2. Doors locked is a state law
 - a. Students have responded well to it
