Meeting Minutes:

Meeting began at 6:23 after a fire alarm in the fieldhouse locker room required campus evacuation.

SAC attendees introduced themselves.

Motion to adopt the agenda was made by Frank Brunner| Second by Julie Alejos.

Minutes from the May 2022 SAC meeting were read and approved with the addition of 2022-2023 SAC Board Member names being included: J. Alejos-Chair, L. Dunston—Vice Chair, P. Komishane—Secretary/Treasurer.

Mrs. Scarbrough presented a PowerPoint explaining the role and responsibilities of the SAC committee. Mr. Brunner asked for a list of 22-23 SAC meetings:

22-23 School Improvement Plan| Plan was presented to the committee in two forms, the complete 18-page draft along with the one-page quick facts. Mr. Brunner asks the acronyms: ELA (English Language Arts), SWD (Students with Disabilities), ELL (English Language Learner), ASN (Asian), FRL (free and reduced lunch) be explained to the committee. Brunner also asked:

- What components comprise the acceleration grade? **Acceleration includes dual-enrollment, Advanced Placement courses, vocational courses with a certification, AICE.**
- Are we tracking the drop-out rate?
- Does MHS have much migrant worker enrollment?
- Does the school still receive a SAC budget?
- What type of bell schedule is the school on? When is the first bell? When is dismissal?

Accreditation| An overview of the school's accreditation process by given by Dr. Francis. Discussed that accreditation occurs on a five-year cycle in the educational organization is evaluated on 30 standards that measure the school's systems around teaching, learning, climate, and culture. Mrs. Scarbrough discussed the evolution in the process from a week-long visit by a team of evaluators to the current model in which the school uses an electronic 'filing cabinets' to load documents that are reviewed by single evaluator remotely. Surveys for students, staff, and parents will be shared on Wednesday, September 14th and remain open through September 21st.

State of the School|

Non-instructional report—Positive atmosphere. Students seem enthused to return to school. College Fair for upperclass on Friday. Fifty schools will be represented. The list of schools is available on Schoology. Mrs. Norris will visit with College Prep Academy freshman so that they will know what to expect. Frank Brunner gave kudos to Mrs. Norris as not every high school has a college fair. Mrs. Norris works to ensure Manatee High School is included in

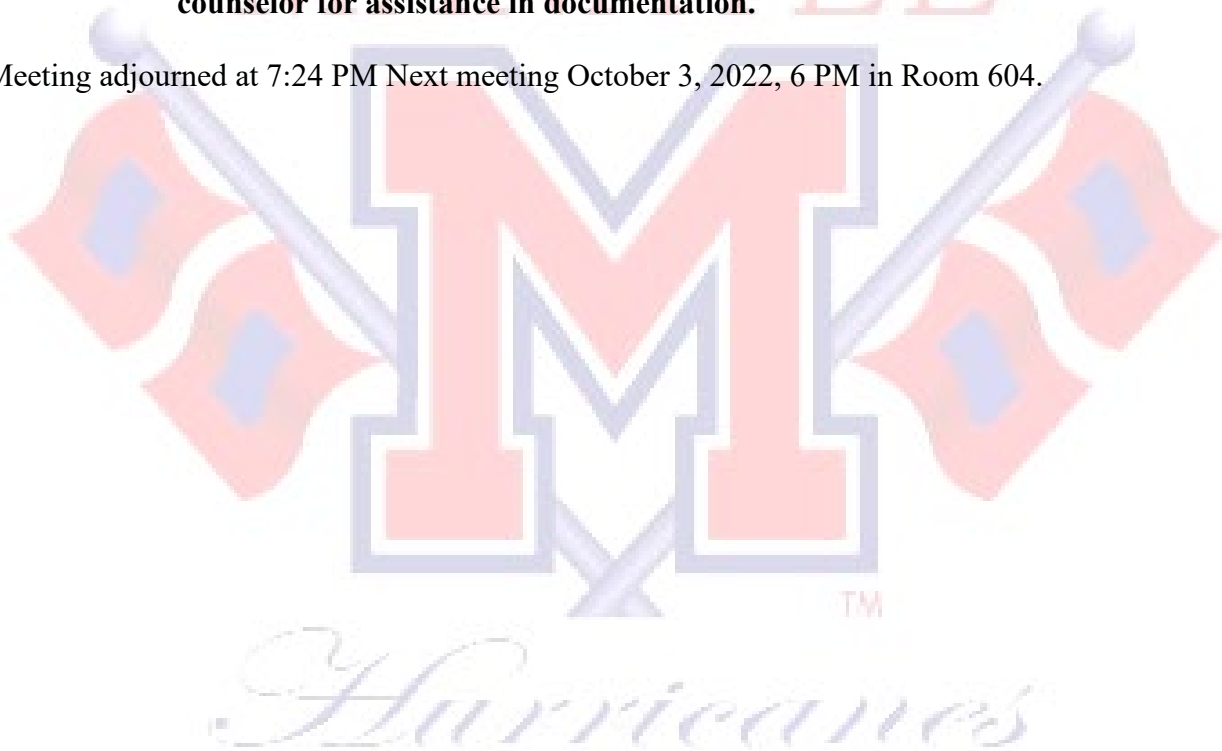
the fall college tour circuit. PSAT will be administered on October 12th to all 10th graders. Others may opt-in. The test is the way 11th graders may compete for National Merit Scholar status.

- What is the latest update for community service hours|Bright Futures? **Still awaiting FDOE guidance. Mr. Brunner provided information about the non-profits he heads. Both provide community service opportunities. Mrs. Scarbrough directed parents to consult with the appropriate guidance counselor for assistance in documentation.**
