

61% of survey responders know the 9th grade counselor

Only 41% know how to request an appointment

76% of survey responders felt confident in their knowledge of graduation requirements

83% felt confident in their knowledge about how GPA is calculated

Less than 60% of survey responders knew the correct number of credits required for graduation

Less than 50% knew the correct GPA


Graduation Requirements

Four Years in High School:

- O Minimum Number of Credits = 24
- O Grade Point Average (GPA) = 2.00
- Statewide Assessments =

Algebra 1 EOC and 10th Grade FAST ELA

- o English = 4 credits
- o Math = 4 credits







How is high school different from middle school?


Middle School
