Something to keep in mind . . .

7 Classes

X 2 Semesters

X 4 Years =

56 Grades per Student X 414 Students in the Senior Class =

23,184 Grades

(excluding any grades earned during middle school or through FLVS or Edgenuity)

23,184 Grades divided amongst 4 Counselors =

5,796 Grades per Counselor

Even at a 1% error margin, that means 57 grades could be accidentally overlooked.

It only takes one missing credit for <u>your</u> diploma to be in jeopardy.

What are my graduation requirements?

- An unweighted cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher
- 24 credits in specific content areas
- A passing score on the Grade 10 FSA ELA and a passing score on the Algebra 1 EOC or appropriate concordant score(s)

Note: Participation in EOCs for Geometry, Biology, and US History will count as 30% of the final grade for each course.



What are the required 24 credits?

For High School Graduation:

- 4 credits in English
- 4 credits in Math (including Algebra I and Geometry)
- 3 credits in Science (including Biology)
- 3 credits in Social Studies
- HOPE **
- 1 credit in a Fine Art
- 8 credits in Electives
- 1 course completed through an online program (FLVS or MVS)**

** Any full-time e-learners from 2020/2021 school year have meet the online requirement.

Hybrid students from 2020/2021 school year have met the online requirement if you have taken a 1 semester course (i.e. Psych 1 or PE).

Not Required but Strongly Recommended

- Two consecutive years of a Foreign Language
- Algebra II or other higher level Math courses
- ACT or SAT Tests
- Community Service Hours




Florida Virtual School Enrollment

All students who enter high school in the 2020-2021 school year must complete one course through online learning in order to earn a State of Florida diploma.


Enrollment in an FLVS course is free of charge and classes are available year-round.

Students must remember that "completing a course through online learning" means that if a course is offered for 1.0 credit, both semesters must be completed.

It is strongly encouraged that students complete courses that are offered for 0.50 credit.

What is Advanced Placement (AP)?



Nationally standardized, college-level curriculum developed by College Board in over 30 subject areas.



Opportunity to earn credit for college by achieving a specific score an AP exam at the end of the year.



Exams are scored on scale of 1-5. Typically, a Level 3 or higher awards credit.



AP Classroom is a virtual tool that benefits students as they prepare for the AP exams.



What is Dual Enrolment?

- Dual Enrollment provides an opportunity for students to earn credits for courses that meet both high school graduation requirements and can be used towards a degree program at the collegiate level.
- Student can enroll in part-time or full-time dual enrollment programs while in high school.
- BRHS partners with three institutions for DE:
 - University of South Florida
 - State College of Florida
 - Manatee Technical College
