## **FAFSA – Free Application for Federal Student Aid**

The FAFSA is the form seniors need to fill out to get any financial aid from the federal government to help pay for college. Each year, over 13 million students who file the FAFSA get more than \$120 billion in grants, work-study, and low-interest loans from the U.S. Department of Education.

**ALL** seniors should complete the FAFSA. <u>For the Class of 2024, the FAFSA has several changes and the application won't open until January 2024</u>. It's a good idea to submit the application as soon as possible after it opens because financial aid is often given out on a first-come, first-served basis.

Some colleges have deadlines or priority dates for your FAFSA to be completed and submitted. Meeting the priority deadline date allows you the best opportunity to be considered for the most aid types possible. Check the deadlines for each college you are applying to.

## Steps for the Class of 2024:

- 1. **Create your FSA ID** which is how you will sign the online FAFSA. The student and parent must create their own unique FSA IDs. This must be done before completing the FAFSA. Make sure you save your username and password.
- 2. On/after January 1, 2024, go to the FAFSA Website, create an account, and complete the 2024-2025 FAFSA form.
