3 Ways to Support Learning at Home

1. Read with your child every day.

Create a habit of reading by reading aloud to your child or listening to your child read aloud every day. Encourage your children to read to each other.

2. Make reading fun!

- Create a special reading spot in your home.
- Vary reading stories, comics, biographies, history books, or any other topics your child is interested in.

3. Ask questions about what your child reads.

Having conversations with your child about what he/she is reading can improve comprehension and help to develop critical thinking and language skills. One activity you can do with your child is 3 2 1. While reading, ask your child to tell you:
