CITIZENS FINANCIAL OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE CHARTER

August 24, 2021

MISSION

The mission of the Citizen's Financial Oversight Committee ("Committee") as constituted in School Board of Manatee County, Florida, ("School Board") Resolution 2017-11 is to provide oversight to ensure proper fiscal stewardship of operating funds provided by the Special Election approving a one-mill increase in the school ad valorem tax as provided by Section 1001.73(2) of the Florida Statutes and future extensions of the additional millage.

The Committee shall issue an annual report no later than sixty days after the School Board certifies it annual financial report to ensure proper fiscal stewardship of the funds generated by the additional ad valorem taxes. Also, the Committee shall identify relevant outcomes and report results to the community.

The School Board has pledged "that the revenues generated by the additional millage for operational purposes shall be used to increase student achievement through more instructional time and after-school tutoring, recruit and retain teachers and staff with competitive salaries, expand Career and Technical Education and STEM programs to prepare students for the workforce, and to support charter schools. The money shall only be used for the purposes listed above."

It is the Committee's charge to verify, comment, and report compliance with the School Board's pledge of the use of the funds from the Ad Valorem Millage Election.

COMPOSITION OF COMMITTEE

The Committee members consist of volunteers appointed by the School Board. The Committee members must be independent and not employees of the Manatee County School District or otherwise have a continuing conflict of interestwith the Committee and its work and/or Charter. A Committee member shall be deemed independent if the member is compliant with Chapter 112, Part III, Florida Statutes, the Code of Ethics for Public Officers and Employees. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the president of the Manatee Education Association and the president of the local chapter of the American Federation of State, County, and

Municipal Workers, who represent employees of the School Board in collective bargaining, are standing members of the Committee.

Effective June 30, 2021, the Committee will consist of a minimum of seven and a maximum of twelve members. The term of the members will coincide with the School District's fiscal year ended June 30. All terms will be for three (3) years. Should vacancies occur on the Committee, the School Board may appoint a replacement to fill the vacancy for the remainder of the vacant term. Candidates for membership shall be interviewed by the Chair of the Citizens' Financial Oversight Committee and one Board Member.

Committee members are subject to the Florida Government in the Sunshine Laws and members will be required to attend an introductory course to the Florida Open Government Laws within a reasonable time after their initial appointments to the Committee. Committee members may be removed from the Committee by the School Board for any of the following reasons: resignation by the member, lack of attendance (miss 3 consecutive meetings without communication with the Committee Chair), or for repetitive failure to adhere to the required responsibilities or standard of conduct expected of a Committee member.

ADMINISTRATIVE

The Committee shall meet at least quarterly and more frequently if the need arises. A quorum shall be a majority of the membership plus one. The Committee will review the School Board at least quarterly. The Committee will review the Committee Charter and submit any recommended changes to the School Board for its review and approval no less than annually. All decisions shall be reached by a majority of the members present. Any recommendations to the School Board shall be approved by a supermajority (67%) of the Citizens' Financial Oversight Committee membership. The Committee will select the Chairman and Vice-Chairman annually. Vacancies in the office of Chair and Vice-chair shall be filled by the Committee.

There may be Subcommittees to divide the workload and members of the Citizens' Financial Oversight Committee will be appointed by the Chair to these committees. The Citizens' Financial Oversight Committee may establish or dissolve subcommittees by a majority vote of the Committee.

The School Board will provide administrative support and access to information and/or data as is necessary for the Committee to perform its assigned tasks. The School Board shall assign Committee members a School District email account used for all Committee and official mailings. Official email accounts are restricted to official use and shall not be used for personal mailings or any other personal business. The Committee's meeting agenda and minutes of the meetings will be provided to the School District's Agency Clerk for posting on the School District's website and will be maintained as per Florida Statute.
