- FSA ID for yourself

- Driver License Number
- 2020 W-2 forms and other records of money earned during that year
- 2020 Federal Income Tax Return
- Current business and investment mortgage information
- Business and farm records
- Stock, bonds, and other investment records
- Alien registration or permanent resident card (if you are not a U.S. citizen)

**FAFSA opens on October 1<sup>st</sup>!**

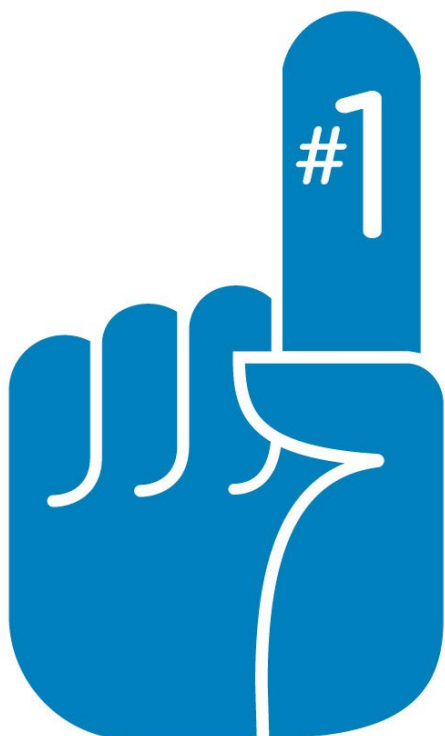
FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) determines eligibility for financial aid for college, including grants and scholarships. Under the fiscal year 2022 proposal, the maximum **Pell Grant** in award year 2022-23 will be **\$8,370**, an increase of \$1,875.

First, search ***create an FSA ID*** or take a photo of the link below.

Next, create an FSA ID (a username and password) for you and a parent, using two different emails. Mark your calendars for the first FAFSA virtual workshop on **October 7<sup>th</sup>** to receive assistance from financial aid experts to complete the FAFSA.

If you answer “yes” to any question, you are independent and should not include parental information on the FAFSA.
