Academies continue to ensure that students are a part of a "small learning community" that assists each student in reaching his/her identified educational and career goals. Academies are a type of "school-within-aschool" that provide a smaller environment where students feel connected to a specific group of teachers and students that have similar interests and plans.

ACADEMY HIGHLIGHTS

Every student at Braden River High School is in one of the four academies. Academies allow for work-based learning, industry certifications and job shadowing opportunities centered on different career fields. Students have the opportunity to switch to a different academy each year to explore what each academy has to offer.
