

Lakewood Ranch High School School Advisory Committee Meeting Agenda Tuesday April 12, 2022 6:00-7:00 pm ~ Teams Meeting(online)

I. Welcome and Approval of Minutes- Mrs. Galindo Mrs. Galindo started the meeting at 6:07 PM. Mrs. Mount motioned to start the meeting and Mrs. Salcido seconded. Mrs. Cornelius motioned to approve the minutes and Mrs. Mount seconded, the previous minutes were approved.

II. New Business

- a. State Testing- Lowen because of the lost time due to covid, kids have been making up testes and there was some learning losses. Current seniors had a hard time with testing due to covid and online learning. There was a hard curve to get over with seniors to pass the tests they need to pass to graduate. Seniors who did not pass their FSA were also given the options of the Pert and SAT to count for those skills. Last week 9th and 10th grade students started the writing FSA and in May they will take the reading FSA. These tests were prepared for by students English teachers. Students cannot take the reading portion without doing the writing portion. 97.1 % of students have taken the writing FSA. Schools need to have 95% of students tested to receive a school grade. The first 2 weeks of May will be for the reading FSA and the Senior Civics Exam, AP testing and EOC's will also take place in May. With the 9th and 10th grade students combined over 1100 students will be tested. The school hopes to get an A rating. This year admin feel as in "Lakewood is back" in the testing world
- b. AP testing- Galindo There are 766 AP students testing 1,322 AP tests costing 10021. The nest closed school testes only about 500 AP tests.

There are 45 students that will be taking Calc AB, 13 taking Calc BC, 22 in computer science, 162 in English, 62 in AP Literature , and 142 in AP Psychology. There are a lot of restrictions on who can proctor an AP exam so teachers who are eligible to will be busy. The school gets 1500\$ to help with exams this is mostly used for hiring subs. Each teacher gets 50\$ per students who passes, teacher like Mrs. Selene's and Mrs. McCarthy both have high pass rates.

c. The members present during this meeting did a SAC self evaluation, and talked about how to improve participation in meetings in the future.

- III. Principal Update Mr. Dalquest was not in attendance. Prom was April 8th the first one in three years due to COVID. All students got home safely. The SGA advisor will be changing next year from Mrs. Riggins to Mr. Cuervo. Today was national signing day and we had 14 students sign to continue their academic and athletic careers in college. Last week SGA and Stampede held a dodgeball tournament with a great turnout of 11 teams. Early Childhood students start their formal observations tomorrow in hopes of obtaining their CDA's (Child Development Associate). Teacher award night is being started by SGA students and will come out soon.
