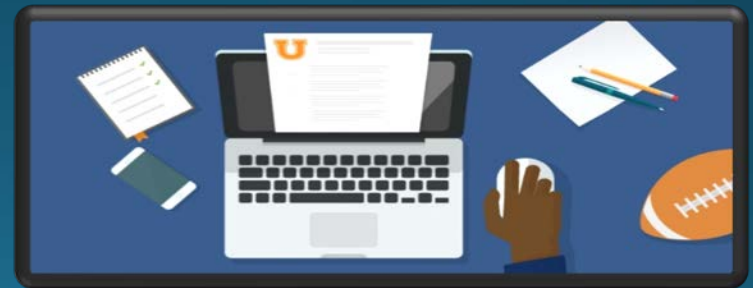


Florida Virtual School Enrollment

- (4) Submit the Service Log and Evaluation form.
- (5) For group projects, do not complete the Pre-Approval Form.
