New business:

Bylaw approval- Ms. Wood:

- The bylaws were approved

Referendum update- Mr. Little:

- The voting to renew the millage tax is November 2
- Millage tax
 - 30 extra minutes of school day
 - Competitive salaries
 - Improves technology and STEM programs
- Mrs. Dannehl brought up two concerns about the referendum:
 - She has not seen a lot of information regarding voting
 - She questioned how our school would be affected if the referendum was not passed
 - It would not affect the school for another year, but it could potentially cause a loss in the 30 extra minutes and less money for teachers and programs.

Schedule Change/Homeroom update- Ms. Gagnon:

- 40% of students had some sort of schedule change
 - Shifted period or teacher, not class
- Decreased class sizes

SAT/PSAT/Mental Health Day- Ms. Gagnon:

- Over 800 students are testing on Wednesday, October 13
- Other students are completing State required mental health training
 - Testing students will make this up throughout the year during their history and English classes

Car Rider Line- Ms. Wood:

- Car line has not been moving smoothly because of the large increase in students
 - Causes parents to drop off in the student parking lot and illegally on Moccasin Wallow road
- Suggested that one factor in this could be that only one lane is open
- Solutions:
 - Working to get a gate put in the North side to prevent skipping the line
 - Look at data about the line to see if there are other solutions
 - Create a task force
