

SAC Meeting

March 3, 2022

6:30 PM via Zoom

Mr. Champagne welcomed everyone to the meeting.

The minutes from the last meeting were approved.

There was no old business.

New business:

Teacher Appreciation Week:

- May 2nd-May 6th this year
- Mr. Champagne complimented SAC on the success of last year's Teacher Appreciation Week
- Mr. Little added that teachers are still talking about last year's Teacher Appreciation Week
- Ms. Juliano and Ms. Jenn volunteered to create the sign up for this year

Traffic update- Mr. Little:

- The school is growing, and there are more underclassmen that can drive now, so there is a lot more traffic in the mornings
- There will be a study of the traffic patterns to see the issue, but admin believes the traffic circle on Fort Hamer Rd is the major source of the holdup
- Admin wants to be able to solve the problem so it will not be an issue next year

Registration Update- Ms. Gagnon:

- Counselors have begun meeting students one-on-one during social studies classes
- Counselor meetings allow students to review their schedules and make changes if needed
- Meetings will last through the first week of April
- There are a lot of new courses being offered for next year, mostly electives
- New courses will be dropped if there are fewer than 25 students interested

Principal's Update:

- PCHS is starting to be "On the Map" – other people are starting to notice PCHS because of the school's successful programs
- Our school is preparing to allocate for 2,000 students next year. The school will be able to handle this number next year, but a new building will need to be completed for the following year.
- Mr. Little has been approving various senior privileges for the first graduating class.
- Senior awards and graduation auditions are coming up soon.
- COVID has been going down, so the school has been able to open up a lot more

- Questions:
 - How does transportation for sports work?
 - Within a certain number of miles, students can drive themselves. It depends on the situation in some cases.
 - Ms. Wood briefly discussed the negativity shown on Facebook pages. She suggested SAC work to add positive comments and help the parents. Mr. Little suggested SAC members redirect these complaints to admin. She also mentioned PCHS students have been featured in the Good News website. The website shares positive news from around the school district.
