

SAC Minutes

April 4, 2022

Mr. Champagne welcomed everyone to the meeting.

The minutes from last meeting were approved.

Old Business:

Teacher Appreciation Week:

- Gift baskets and gift cards have been coming in for Teacher Appreciation week
- 47 of the 152 slots on the sign-up have been filled
- Mr. Champagne requested the SAC members promote the sign-up genius link through their social media
- A concern regarding incorrect links being shared will be addressed

New Business:

FSA Requirements:

- Even though FSA is being phased out after this year, the FSAs are still required for the 2021-22 school year and will not be excused

Testing:

- Testing season is soon
- FSA, EOC, AP, and AICE (general paper) testing goes from around mid-April to mid-May
- Teachers are working hard to prepare students for their AP tests
- Around 4 proctors are needed for the AICE testing

Discipline Review:

- PCHS is the 4th largest school in the district (on track to be the 2nd) and it has the least amount of referrals which is a good reflection of the school
- The discipline administration attempts to be fair, firm, and consistent
- The school discipline matrix is aligned with the district code of conduct
- The discipline matrix was approved for the 2022-23 school year. The matrix will be the same as the 2021-22 year, and it will be adjusted in the summer to line up with any new rules added to the district code of conduct.

SAC Review:

- The SAC evaluation was accepted by the members as an accurate reflection of the 2021-22 SAC meetings.

Principal's update:

- Mr. Little opened with a thank you to the assistant principals because it is National Assistant Principal Week.

- The admin will be meeting with the district school traffic coordinator to attempt to work out the issue with student drop-off and pick-up.
 - Even though they have no control over the roads, this will hopefully result in a way to ease the flow of traffic
- PCHS' first prom is this Saturday, and the ticket sales are good
- The Student Government Association (SGA) will be expanding to be after school next year along with the class
 - There are also plans for each grade level to have a representative that will meet with Mr. Little once a month
- Teacher position openings will be in late April
- Project digitalize is beginning to transfer student files to an online database
- The district SAC meeting has been cancelled
- PCHS' first graduation is coming up soon
- Mr. Little thanked the parent representatives on the SAC meetings
- This will be the last SAC meeting for the 2021-22 school year

Questions:

- How do sports teams get funding?
 - The district provides some funding, but it is not nearly enough
 - The booster club conducts fundraisers like the Bitty Bulls Camp over the summer
 - The athletic department conducts fundraising
 - Individual teams conduct their own fundraisers as well
- Addressed rumor about pool being built on campus- there is not a plan for this, but people have been asking to get a pool in the area
