September 12th, 2022

Mr. Champagne welcomed everyone to the meeting.

The minutes from last meeting were approved.

Old Business:

FSA/FAST Testing:

- FSA Retakes begin tomorrow
- FAST Reading Testing occurred last week
- 95% of 9th/10th grade students sat for testing.
- 11th and 12th graders (based off current state directive) can use the FAST to graduate if lacking concordant scores
- Some schools (TBD) will be piloting FAST Writing Test
- NEW FAST Test decreases the amount of testing and time out of the classroom. Progress monitoring occurs in Fall, Winter, and Spring. Progress monitoring #1 completed.
- Other- 10/12/22 is PSAT/SAT day. Approx. 800 students will test. School-wide will have modified schedule. Non-testing students will be engaged in activities (TBD).

Traffic Study:

- Concluded traffic pattern is acceptable
- Other- Traffic for the 22-23 is running smooth. Frequency of student tardies is lower than in previous years.

Bylaws were reviewed. They have not changed since last year.

New Business:

SIP:

- Mrs. Bieber presented last year's school grade. Scored only on 8 domains/10 domains since graduation rate and acceleration rate were not included.
- Positives include leading the district in 5/8 areas and met 100% of our learning gain goals
- Without graduation rate and acceleration rate, our school grade was calculated a C.
- For the 22-23 school year, school grade will now be calculated using 6 domains: reading achievement, math achievement, science achievement, social studies achievement, graduation rate and college/career acceleration rate. L25s and learning gains are no longer included in the calculation.

- This year, we will have graduation rate and acceleration rate (CTE, AICE, AP, DE) included which is based off the previous year's rates.
- Proficiency is our goal for the 22-23 school year.
- Attainable draft SIP goals include increases in proficiency as follows: 5% in reading, 2% in math, 7% in science, and 5% in social studies.
- Using draft SIP goals and predictions of 92% graduation rate and 60% acceleration rate, our school grade would calculate as a 401/600 points =67% A. 62% or higher equates to A rated school.
- If SIP draft is approved by SAC, it will move onto the district for approval, and then move onto the state.
- To achieve our SIP goals, we will take the following action steps:
 - Follow standards-based curriculum
 - Progress monitor from the district and state
 - Add tiered support and apply interventions
 - Differentiate lessons
 - Conduct thorough data analysis (continuation of)
 - Meet with Instructional Leadership Teams monthly, department leads return with information to further support their teams
 - Administrators will provide support to their assigned subject areas

Motion: Accept SIP goals as stated by Ms. Wood. 2nd by Ms. Morris. **Motion approved.**

Principal's Update:

- Enrollment has increased by approximately 340 students from 21-22 to current school year.
- PCHS hired 40+ new staff members.
- Teacher shortage has been a challenge and applications were far lower than in previous years. Many applicants chose PCHS. Mr. Little attributed the desirability of the school to a positive reputation and school culture.
- Culture is growing. We had an excellent turnout at the Homecoming Dance this past Saturday and at tonight's Spirit Week Game Show night.
