# Sight Word Work Menu

**Use watercolor paints to paint the sight words.**

**Memory:**  
Make playing cards for 5 to 10 sight words (2 cards for each word). Make sure the words can not be seen through the back. Follow traditional Memory rules.

**Use coins to make your sight words.**

**Go Fish:**  
Create playing cards (2 cards for each word). Make sure your words can not be seen through the back. Follow traditional Go Fish rules.

*Call out a sight word and have your child build the sight word using magnetic alphabet letters.*

Give your child a small amount of shaving cream and have them write their sight words on a smooth or flat surface.

*Write the sight words in pencil and then trace over the letters with different color crayons/markers.*

**Back Writing:**  
Have your child write the word with their finger on your back and see if you can guess the word.

**Ball Toss:**  
Call out a sight word, then spell the sight word as you toss the ball back and forth.

Have a parent help you send an email to your teacher where you used each word in a sentence.

**Hula hoop or jump rope while spelling sight words out loud.**

Use a magazine to cut out the word, or find letters to cut out to build each word.

**Decorate the sidewalk with your words in chalk.**

Look for words in newspapers. When you find one highlight it!

*Build the words with Play-Doh.*

**Play Tic-Tac-Toe with your two words.**

Pour flour on the counter or in a pan and write your words.

Type them in fun fonts on the computer.

**Beat the Clock:**  
How many times can a word be written in one minute?

Paint your words outside using water and a paintbrush.

**Use sidewalk chalk to make a hopscotch game with your words in each box.**

Spell your sight words with cereal or other small snack foods.

**Stepping Stones:**  
Place words on the floor and walk over them, while saying each word, to cross the stream.

Tape words all over a wall. Use a flashlight to shine on a word and read out loud.
