- 2) Approval of Minutes (Charity Wharton): 6:05 p.m.
  - Minutes were motioned to be approved by K. Parker and seconded by C. Geiger. Motion was carried and minutes were approved.
- 3) District SAC Mtg. Review (Charity Wharton): 6:06 p.m.
  - Talked about construction projects around the district: Schools needing improvements have two budgets: one for new schools and one for up-keep
  - Schools to be renovated:
    - o Tara, Blackburn, Palma Sola, Nolan
    - o 6 new rooms at Freedom
    - o New science rooms at Southeast
    - o 16 rooms added at Parrish and 20 to be added to LRHS
  - There is potential for rezoning after construction on schools is completed, but there is no timeline for rezoning currently.
  - \$660 million for planning, design, and new construction
  - Up keep budget: \$200 million
  - New Schools:
    - Artisan Lakes (between Palmetto and Parrish) \$56 million allocated,
      964 students, projected completion around Aug 2026
- 4) Media Center Books/Challenged (Matthew Whelden): 6:10 p.m.
  - Approx. 25 books have been challenged to date.
  - Challenge comes from a parent, parent group, or anyone in the community who wants a book pulled from a school. A review committee reviews the challenged book to determine if the book should be removed or if the parent should have to sign off on if the student can check out a book.
  - District can ban books school-wide without review.
    - Q: Are the students aware of the book challenge?
    - A: Unless a teacher brings it up, students are more than likely not aware of the book challenge.

- 5) Qtr. 1 Benchmark Data (Matthew Whelden): 6:15 p.m.
  - Benchmarks have been completed.
  - Teachers should get an idea of where their students are in the learning process and what may need to be recovered or how to progress moving forward.
  - At BRHS, US History is top in district, Geometry and Biology are second behind LRHS, and Algebra and ELA are in the middle.

  - Two student center resources both are available to students on their My SDMC SSO:
    - o Xello
      - College and career readiness
      - Planning for the future
      - On the academy day coming up in November, all students will be accessing Xello and taking self-assessments to start making their portfolios.
    - o Paper
      - Web-based tutoring system
      - Similar to a Kahn Academy but will help walk students through problems and understand the curriculum in any content area
  - Teacher Representive for Excellence in Education Award: Stefanie Minihan (advertising teacher, SGA co-advisor, runs Captains Cargo)
  - Volleyball team won Districts and keeps advancing
  - Raiders did well at both competitions; Rifle team doing well at start of their season
  - MBOP came in 1<sup>st</sup> at both state competitions so far
  - Cross country and swimming are under way.
    - Q: What happened with the signs that were displayed at the volleyball game that were not nice to the competing team?
    - A: The signs were taken down as soon as admin was made aware and the students made a poor decision. Not tasteful at all. All signs must now be preapproved.
