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LEARNING SCIENCE IS FUN AT CAMP S.N.A.P.

(Bradenton, FL – June 14, 2017) Camp S.N.A.P. (Science Nature Adventure Program) is a summer program which offers Title I students from Manatee County countless learning opportunities to explore the wonders of nature. Eligible 4th, 5th, 7th, and 8th grade students are participating in the week-long camps, which run through June 22nd.

Exciting learning activities include hiking, kayaking, removing exotic species, and learning about carbon footprints. Dynamic teachers and volunteers will also help students build oyster mats, examine a collection of organisms under a microscope, explore marine life by dip netting, learning about the effect of humans on the environment, and immersing themselves in fun, science-related activities. Students will be taking daily field trips including Coquina Beach/Leffis Key, Myakka River State Park, Robinson Preserve, and The Florida Aquarium.

Title I Camp S.N.A.P. partnered with The Florida Youth Conservation Centers Network (FYCCN), WayneAdventures, Manatee County Parks and Natural Resources, and Florida State Parks for activities provided during the program.
