<p align="center">Sign-in &amp; welcome</p>	<p>Meeting started at 8:05 am Bee Vang welcomed everyone to the new school year. She thanked everyone for attending our first SAC meeting.</p>
<p align="center">SAC Board Election for 2017-2018</p>	<p>The SAC flyer went home to parents September 6. September 8-16 was no school due to hurricane Irma. The bottom portion of the SAC flyer included a tear off to nomination for SAC Chair for 2017-2018 and/or if parents wanted to be SAC members this school year. Due to the hurricane school closure, this might be a reason where parents might have not had the chance to turn slips back to school. Mrs. West recommended that the SAC Chair election be table to the October SAC meeting. Everyone agreed.</p>
<p align="center">School Improvement Plan and Budget for 2017-2018</p>	<p>Mrs. West shared that the SIP is completed. The due date was move a week later due to hurricane school closures. It is being revised and due Friday, September 22. The SIP goals this year is to increase student achievement scores 40% or more in the areas of math, science, writing and reading. Our school is also getting the UniSIG grant of \$308,940.00. With the grant, the school is hoping to hire two additional paraprofessionals and 2 permanent substitute teachers. We hope to receive the grant in October. This year with some of the SIP funds, the school has purchased and is using Math Acaletics for 30 minutes each day with students and are looking into the science one as well. Our school grade is a D and with the district mandates, we are doing the extended day push-in to the classrooms for an hour with extra support with SRA. SRA is taught by certified teachers in the classrooms and are focused in small group instruction.</p>
<p align="center">School Safety &amp; Security</p>	<p>Mrs. West shared that our school was used as a shelter during the hurricane evacuation. Almost 2000 people seek shelter here. There were 3 other principals here to help with registration and to help run the shelter. The school had 5 national guardsmen and 4 officers here as well to help monitor the building. There must have been 100 plus pets during the evacuation. Overall, everything went smooth. The school lost power Saturday and the generator did not work. There were two minor incidents, but it got taken care of right away. Mrs. West also expressed her concern about student tardiness. It is a problem. Parents are not bringing the students to school on time with the school hours changed. It is not that the lines are long. The long lines have gotten better with time. Breakfast starts at 7:30 am. On the street for extra safety issues. Mrs. West have asked the county/city to hold the light for 5</p>

	<p>extra seconds and requested for more police help with arrival and dismissal time, but have not gotten any. Parents are parking across the library parking lot and kids crossing on their own. This is not safe for students. The District people came out to look at our arrival and dismissal time and they said we were fine.</p>
<p>Parental Involvement Update</p>	<p>Mrs. Vang gave an update on Parental Involvement. The first parent workshop will be on Wednesday, September 27<sup>th</sup> from 1:00 pm to 2:00 pm in room 132. The topics are The Walking School Bus and The Importance of Daily School Attendance. The Adult English Class will start in October. Mrs. Annie Marquez will be the instructor. Mrs. Vang will check and see if any paras in the school would like to do the Childcare for the Adult English Class. The school Event Calendar for 2017-2018 is being worked on. We hope to finish it by the end of September. Parents will receive copies so they are aware of the different events coming up for the school year.</p>
<p>Other businesses</p>	<p>Mrs. West shared that Mr. Zahara is the computer tech person and is retiring. His last day is Tuesday, September 26. Tom Moore will be the new tech person. He comes from the EBD classroom. A new EBD para will need to be hired. Mr. Jolley, a 5<sup>th</sup> grade teacher recently resigned. His class is being split until a new teacher can be hired.</p> <p>Mrs. Diana Wendell updated about the Elf Shop for this school year. The set-up date and open date is November 27<sup>th</sup>. Melanie and Trudi said they can help too. Three other parents to help as well.
